- 1. a). State six conditions given by God to the Israelites during the renewal of the Sinai covenant. (6mks)
 - To obey what God commanded them.
 - Not to make any treaty with people of the land where they were going.
 - To destroy their altars/sacred stones/cut down their Asherah.
 - Not to worship any idol/other gods.
 - To keep the feast of unleavened bread.
 - To rest on the Sabbath day.
 - Not to intermarry with foreigners.
 - Not to make idols.
 - To offer to God the first fruits of their crops.
 - To dedicate all their first born male children. And first born male of their domestic animals to God.
 - b). Describe how the Sinai covenant was sealed. (7mks)
 - Moses built an altar of 12 stones/pillars to represent the 12 tribes of Israel.
 - He sent young men to offer/sacrifice oxen to the lord as burnt offering.
 - He took half of the blood and poured in a basin.
 - Half of the blood was sprinkled in the altar.
 - He then took the book of the covenant and read it to the Israelites.
 - The Israelites promised to obey God.
 - He took the remaining blood and sprinkled it upon the people/Israelites.
 - The blood was the seal of the covenant that the lord made with the people.
 - God promised to bless them, if they obey him.
 - A new relationship was established between God and the Israelites.
 - c). Why do some Christians find it difficult to follow the law of God. (7mks)
 - Lack of faith.

- 2. a). outline six roles of priests in traditional African communities. (6mks)
 - They gave sacrifices to God and poured libations to ancestors.
 - They act as advisors of the community.
 - The priest interceded or offered prayers to God, spirits and ancestors on behalf of the people. they are the religious symbols of God's presence in the community.
 - In some communities the priests can act as a political leader.
 - They solved or settled disputes in the society/judged cases.
 - Priests precide over religious ceremonies and festivals in their communities.
 - They take care of shrines or places of worship.
 - They are custodians of customs, taboos and traditions of the community.
 - b). explain four importance of kinship ties in traditional African communities. (8mks)
 - Kinship ties help in preserving traditional customs through informal education.
 - They bind the entire life of a community/unites members of the same clan and family.
 - It helps to maintain law and order in the community.
 - A kinship tie promotes a sense of belonging, identity and security.
 - It defines punishment and reward in the community.
 - It regulates marriage relationship in the community.
 - Kinship ties helps in settling disputes in the community or family.
 - It defines duties/responsibilities of members of the clan or family.
 - It governs the relationship between the living and the dead.
 - Kinship prepares the youth for leadership roles.
 - It enables people to share and help one another.
 - c). Identify six factors that have affected the kinship ties in the traditional African communities. (6mks)
 - Formal education.

 - In both cases signs were given to confirm the messages to Zachariah and Mary.

- b). Show how John the Baptist prepared the way for the messiah. (6mks)
 - He preached repentance for forgives of sins.
 - He introduced Jesus to the public as the Lamb of God that would take away the sins of the world.
 - He baptized people as a symbol of repentance and readiness for the coming of messiah.
 - He baptized Jesus as a way of preparing him for his mission.
 - He preached about good news about the messiah who would come after him and greater than him.
 - He said he was not the messiah.
 - He encouraged the spirit of sharing with less fortunate.
 - He baptized those who repented.
 - Tax collectors were told not to overcharge.
 - He reprimanded Herod for marrying his brother's wife.
 - He advised soldiers not to rob.
- c). With reference to the story of the rich man and Lazarus, explain the teachings of Jesus on the proper use of wealth. (Luke 126:19-31). (7mks)
 - Jesus taught that wealth should be used to alleviate the suffering of others/or help the needy.
 - Wealth should be used to spread the good news.
 - Wealth should be used to serve others and glorify GOD.
 - Wealth should not be used to buy unnecessary luxury materials when others are suffering.
 - Proper use of wealth enables one to be rewarded in heaven.
 - Wealth should not be used to oppress or humiliate the poor.
 - Too much trust in wealth can prevent someone from having eternal life or entering the kingdom of GOD.
 - Wealth is a gift and blessing from GOD/Christians are custodians of wealth.
 - Wealth is temporary/not permanent so should be used wisely.
- 4. a) Outline six signs of the end times as taught by Jesus in (Luke 21:5-38) (6mks)
 - Strange things will happen to heavenly bodies i.e. sun moon star etc.
 - People will come claiming to be the messiah.
 - There will be wars between nations.
 - Natural calamities like earthquakes and roaring of the seas will occur.
